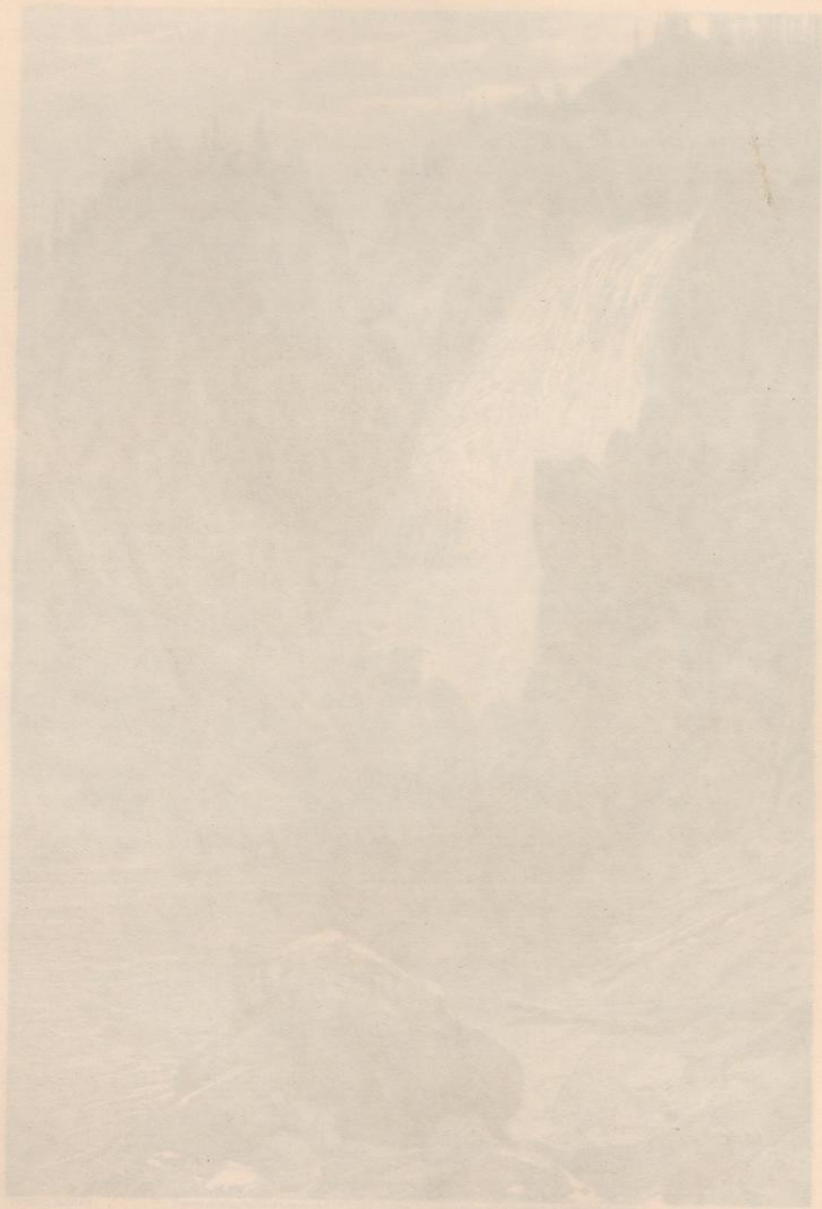
collected quantities. Hundreds of the nuclei or cores of these volcanic vents are now
