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Y Gentleness and good Behaviour had gained so far on the Emperor and his Court, and indeed upon the Army and

People in general, that I began to conceive Hopes of getting my Liberty in a short time. I took all possible Methods to cultivate this favourable Disposition. The Natives came by degrees to be less apprehensive of any Danger from me. I would sometimes lie down, and let sive or

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fix of them dance on my Hand. And last the Boys and Girls would venture to come and play at Hide and Seek in my Hair. I had now made a good Progress in understanding and speaking their Language. The Emperor had a mind one day to entertain me with several of the Country Shows, wherein they exceed all Nations I have known, both for Dexte. rity and Magnificence. I was diverted with none fo much as that of the Rope-Dancers, performed upon a slender white Thread, extended about two Foot, and twelve Inches from the Ground. THIS Diversion is only practised by those Persons who are Candidates for great Employments, and high Favour, at Court. They are trained in this An from their Youth, and are not always of noble Birth, or liberal Education. When a great Office is vacant either by Death or Disgrace (which often happens) sive

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or fix of those Candidates petition the Emperor to entertain his Majesty and the Court with a Dance on the Rope, and whoever jumps the highest without falling, fucceeds in the Office. Very often the Chief Ministers themselves are commanded to shew their Skill, and to convince the Emperor that they have not loft their Faculty. Flimnap, the Treasurer, is allowed to cut a Caper on the strait Rope; at least an Inch higher than any other Lord in the whole Empire. I have seen him do the Summerset several times together upon a Trencher fixed on the Rope, which is no thicker than a common Packthread in England. My Friend Reldre-(al, principal Secretary for private Affairs, is, in my opinion, if I am not partial, the second after the Treasurer; the rest of the great Officers are much upon a Par.

THESE Diversions are often attended with fatal Accidents, whereof great Numbers are on Record. I my felf have seen two or three Candidates break a Limb.

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But the Danger is much greater when the Ministers themselves are commanded to shew their Dexterity; for by contending to excel themselves and their Fellows, they strain so far, that there is hardly one of them who hath not received a Fall, and some of them two or three. I was assured that a Year or two before my Arrival, Flimnap would have infallibly broke his Neck, if one of the King's Cushions, that accidentally lay on the Ground, had not weakened the Force of his Fall.

THERE is likewise another Diversion which is only shewn before the Emperor and Empress, and first Minister, upon particular Occasions. The Emperor lays on a Table three fine silken Threads of six Inches long. One is Purple, the other Yellow, and the third White These Threads are proposed as Prizes for those Persons whom the Emperor hathamind to distinguish by a peculiar Mark of his Favour. The Ceremony is performed in his Majesty's great Chamber of State, where

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where the Candidates are to undergo a Tryal of Dexterity very different from the former, and such as I have not observed the least Resemblance of in any other Country of the old or the new World-The Emperor holds a Stick in his Hands both ends parallel to the Horizon, while the Candidates advancing one by one, sometimes leap over the Stick, sometimes creep under it backwards and forwards feveral times, according as the Stick is advanced or depressed. Sometimes the Emperor holds one end of the Stick, and his first Minister the other; sometimes the Minister has it entirely to himself. Whoever performs his Part with most Agility, and holds out the longest in leaping and creeping, is rewarded with the Purple coloured Silk; the Yellow is given to the next, and the White to the third, which they all wear girttwice round about the middle; and you see few great Persons about this Court, who are not adorned with one of these Girdles.

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two foot from the Ground; then I fastned my Handkerchief to the nine Sticks that flood erect, and extended it on all fides till it was as tight as the top of a Drum; and the four parallel Sticks rifing about five Inches higher than the Handkerchief, ferved as Ledges on each fide. When I had finished my Work, I desired the Emperor to let a Troop of his best Horse, twenty four in number, come and exercise upon this Plain. His Majesty approved of the Proposal, and I took them up one by one in my hands, ready mounted and armed, with the proper Officers to exercise them. As soon as they got into order they divided into two Parties, performed mock Skirmishes, discharged blunt Arrows, drew their Swords, fled and purfued, attacked and retired, and in short discovered the best military Discipline I ever beheld. He then , b commanded his General, (who was an old ea experienced Leader, and a great Patron vel of mine) to draw up the Troops in close oon Order, and march them under me; the sea Foot by twenty-four in a Breast, and ay the Horse by sixteen, with Drums beatot ing, Colours flying, and Pikes advanced. edn This Body confisted of three thousand cha Foot, and a thousand Horse. His Ma-Holjesty gave Orders, upon pain of Death, d by that every Soldier in his March should obnus ferve the strictest Decency, with regard to nalf my Person; which, however, could not prevent some of the younger Officers and from turning up their Eyes as they passed pedunder me. my Breeches were at that time in foll Condition, that they afforded some ( portunities for Laughter and Admirati

I had fent so many Memorials and titions for my Liberty, that his Main at length mentioned the Matter first the Cabinet, and then in a full Count where it was opposed by none, ex Skyresh Bolgolam, who was pleased, w out any Provocation, to be my mo Enemy. But it was carried against by the whole Board, and confirmed the Emperor. That Minister was Ga or Admiral of the Realm, very much his Master's Confidence, and a Po well versed in Affairs, but of a mo and four Complection. 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UNIVERSITÄTS BIBLIOTHEK PADERBORN the Extremities of the Globe; Monar of all Monarchs, taller than the Sons Men; whose Feet press down to the Cater, and whose Head strikes against Sun: At whose Nod the Princes of Earth shake their Knees; pleasant as a Spring, comfortable as the Summer, su ful as Autumn, dreadful as Winter. I most sublime Majesty proposeth to Man-Mountain, lately arrived to our lessial Dominions, the following Article which by a solemn Oath he shall be liged to perform.

FIRST, The Man-Mount din shalls depart from our Dominions, without Licence under our Great Seal.

2<sup>d</sup>, He shall not presume to come to our Metropolis, without our explorer; at which time the Inhabital shall have two hours warning to ke within their doors.

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3<sup>d</sup>, The faid Man-Mountain shall confine his Walks to our principal high Roads, and not offer to walk or lie down in a Meadow or Field of Corn.

4th, As he walks the said Roads, he shall take the utmost care not to trample upon the Bodies of any of our loving Subjects, their Horses, or Carriages, nor take any of our said Subjects into his hands, without their own Consent.

5th, If an Express requires extraordinary Dispatch, the Man-Mountain shall be obliged to carry in his Pocket the Messenger and Horse a Six Days Journey once in every Moon, and return the said Messenger back (if so required) safe to our Imperial Presence.

6th, HE shall be our Ally against our Enemies in the Island of Blefuscu, and do his utmost to destroy their Fleet, which is now preparing to invade us.

7th, THAT

7th, THAT the said Man-Mountain shall, at his times of leisure, be aiding and assisting to our Workmen, in helping to raise certain great Stones, toward covering the Wall of the principal Park and other our Royal Buildings.

8th, THAT the said Man-Mountain shall, in two Moons time, deliver in a exact Survey of the Circumference of our Dominions by a Computation of how own Paces round the Coast.

LASTLY, That upon his solemn Oat to observe all the above Articles, the said Man-Mountain shall have a dail Allowance of Meat and Drink sufficient for the Support of 1728 of our Subject with free Access to our Royal Person and other Marks of our Favour. Give at our Palace at Belfaborac the twelf day of the ninety-first Moon of our Reign.

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I swore and subscribed to these Articles with great Chearfulness and Content, although fome of them were not fo honourable as I could have wished; which proceeded wholly from the Malice of Skyresh Bolgolam the High-Admiral: whereupon my Chains were immediately unlocked, and I was at full liberty; the Emperor himself in Person did me the Honour to be by at the whole Ceremony. I made my Acknowledgments by prostrating myself at his Majesty's Feet: But he commanded me to rise; and after many gracious Expressions. which, to avoid the Cenfure of Vanity, I shall not repeat, he added, that he hoped I should prove a useful Servant, and well deserve all the Favours he had already conferred upon me, or might do for the future.

THE Reader may please to observe, that in the last Article for the Recovery of my Liberty, the Emperor stipulates

to allow me a Quantity of Meat and Drink sufficient for the Support of 1728 Lilliputians. Some time after, asking Friend at Court how they came to fix on that determinate Number; he told me that his Majesty's Mathematicians, having taken the height of my Body by the help of a Quadrant, and finding it to exceed theirs in the Proportion of twelve to one, they concluded from the Simi larity of their Bodies, that mine must contain at least 1728 of theirs, and conse quently would require as much Food a was necessary to support that number of Lilliputians. By which, the Reader may conceive an Idea of the Ingenuity of that People, as well as the prudent and exad Oeconomy of so great a Prince.



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
